

2025 SLL Softball Divisions

	Division	League Age	Description		
H	Tee Ball 1 & 2	3-7	A positive introduction to the baseball and the softball experience, grounded in fun, fitness, and fundamentals that are key to growing a child's love for the game.		
	Rookie League	6-7	An introduction to softball to players that have 1 or more years of experience. Coach-pitch only.		
	89ers	8-9	89ers introduces kid pitching and stealing into regular play. Coaches may be required to pitch as rules and game-play scenarios allow.		
	Minor League	9-11	The Minor League division takes the next step in player development by introducing full kid-pitch play and advanced base stealing scenarios.		
	Major League	10-12	This is a competitive, advanced-play league with strong competition. This is a full kid-pitch division, that will incorporate advanced coaching and playing techniques.		
Registra	Junior League	12-14	These programs are considered more challenging than younger Little League® divisions due to more advanced rules, including the ability to lead-off and steal as the pitcher breaks, along with longer base paths and greater pitching distance.		
SNO	Senior League 13-16		This division uses a 60-foot diamond with a pitching distance of 43 feet. This is the highest division of Little League® and provides the most advanced level of play.		



2025 SLL Baseball Divisions

Division	League Age	Description		
Tee Ball 1 & 2	3-7	A positive introduction to the baseball and the softball experience, grounded in fun, fitness, and fundamentals that are key to growing a child's love for the game.		
Minor League (Rookie, AA & AAA)	6-12	Offered for younger players looking to gain more experience. League instruction starts as coach-pitch and moves to kid-pitch as players move up in age and skill.		
Major League	10-12	This is a competitive, advanced-play league with strong competition. This is a full kid-pitch division, that will incorporate advanced coaching and playing techniques.		
Intermediate League	11-13	This division offers a transition for players between the standard LL field size (46-ft pitching distance and 60-ft base paths).		
Junior League	12-14	These programs are considered more challenging than younger divisions due to more advanced rules, including the ability to lead-off and steal as the pitcher breaks. This division introduces the use a 90-foot diamond with a pitching distance of 60 feet, 6 inches.		
Senior League	13-16	This is the highest division of Little League® and provides the most advanced level of play.



From LLI – The Sport Parent Code of Conduct

The essential elements of character-building and ethics in sports are embodied in the concept of sportsmanship and six core principles:

- Trustworthiness
- Respect
- Responsibility
- Fairness
- Caring
- Good Citizenship



- I will not force my child to participate in sports.
- I will remember that children participate to have fun and that the game is for youth, not adults.
- I (and my guests) will be a positive role model for my child and encourage sportsmanship by showing respect and courtesy, and by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, officials, and spectators at every game, practice or other sporting event.



- I (and my guests) will not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent such as booing and taunting; refusing to shake hands; or using profane language or gestures.
- I will teach my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.



- I will demand that my child treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect regardless of race, creed, color, sex, or ability.
- I will teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game or his/her performance.



- I will praise my child for competing fairly and trying hard, and make my child feel like a winner every time.
- I will never ridicule or yell at my child or other participants for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- I will refrain from coaching my child or other players during games and practices, unless I am one of the official coaches of the team.



- I will respect the officials and their authority during games and will never question, discuss, or confront coaches at the game field, and will take time to speak with coaches at an agreed upon time and place.
- SLL has resources in place for questions and help.



How **WE** keep player safety a #1 priority:

- Background checks are performed for all coaches, managers, and board members.
- •All coaches, managers, and the UIC will receive basic first aid, CPR, and AED operation training – AEDs are onsite.
- All coaches, managers, and the UIC will receive cardiac arrest and concussion protocol training.
- All teams will be issued a first aid kit.
 - Additional first aid supplies and ice packs are stocked in both concession stands.
- All team equipment has been thoroughly inspected.
- USA baseball bats only.
- Maintain a slightly longer grass infield on our t-ball and rookie fields.
- NO DOGS ALLOWED





How **YOU** keep player safety a #1 priority:

- •Give your player's gear a once over.
- Make sure your player has plenty of water.
- Encourage your player to take warmups seriously.
- Encourage your player to have open communication with their coaches.
- Your players know their bodies best.
- •Athletic supporters are required for all male players, rookies and above.
- Athletic cups are required for all male catchers
- Consider using a batting helmet with a jaw guard.
- A limited number of helmets are available to check out.

Concessions Mission


- We are here for your convenience!
